



Beginner Junior Membership

Competitions

9-Hole Main Course Competition

- When: Saturdays 8:00am arrival, 8:15am shotgun start.
- Who: Beginner Juniors and Juniors recommended by the Pro from the Come & Try Clinic.
- Cost: \$5 for members, \$8 for non-members (invite a friend!).
- Meeting Point: Pay at the Pro Shop, register in the Junior Room, then meet at the Par 3 first hole.
- Prizes:
 - A percentage of the total entry fees will be allocated to prize vouchers redeemable in the Pro Shop (approximately 70-80%).
 - The remaining funds will be saved in the junior account for larger future events such as championships and monthly medals.

Handicap

Handicap; provided to the player upon finishing their first round of par 3 golf, to lower handicap you must shoot 2 under your handicap and it is then divided by 2. So, example if the player is off 10 and they shoot 6 over, they are 4 under their handicap and the new handicap would be 8 Note: Handicaps cannot go up in the Junior Beginners golf unless specifically requested.

Junior Beginner Competition

Junior Beginner players may play in Par 3 competition if they are financial Junior Beginner members of PGC or are just visiting. Junior Beginners run a 9-hole competition on the par 3 course every Saturday at 8:15am.

- First game is for a Par 3 handicap, players do not need an official GA handicap
- Junior Beginners members are allowed to play on the par 3 course for competition and social play
- May participate in in the 'Introduction to 18 Holes' competition to progress to Intermediate Member competition play
- A Junior Beginner player must have the approval of either the Club Professional, Director of Golf or the Club Captain to play on the main course
- New Junior Beginner players are advised to be accompanied by a parent or guardian



Beginner Junior Membership

Junior Beginner to Intermediate Progression Requirements

Junior Beginners members must meet these requirements over 9 holes on the par 3 course on Saturdays. A Junior Beginner player must:

- Achieve a par 3 handicap of 10 or less
- Basic understanding of pace of play (this may be observed and approved by the organiser of the par 3 or a PGC pro).
- Be able to hit less than Driver on the following holes to reach the green (2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9).
- Gain approval from PGC Head Professional regarding required level of skill and knowledge
- Upgrade to a financial Junior Intermediate Membership. Junior Beginner can try Saturday
 Intermediates 9 Hole competition a maximum 3 times before transitioning to a Junior
 Intermediates membership. Once the Junior Beginner progresses into Intermediate
 membership, they are no longer eligible to win any prizes in the Junior Beginner Membership
 category they can continue to play and are not required to pay competition entry fee.

Scoring Cards & Scoring System

- 1. Score cards must be legible
- 2. Name clear with surname
- 3. Gross score carried into top section
- 4. Nett score calculated (gross minus handicap)
- 5. Hand in cards to organiser for input into the book held in the pro shop.
- NETT SCORE Lowest Nett score winner (cannot win Gross and Nett) (Nett and Gross same prize) (number 1 prize for Monthly Medal)
- GROSS SCORE Lowest score on the day.
- NETT RUNNER UP 2nd lowest Nett score winner (cannot win Gross and Nett Runner up)
- NEAREST TO PIN (NTP) Player with recorded closest shot to the hole on their SECOND SHOT. Choice of hole is usually predetermined by the organizer.
- FEWEST PUTTS Player with the least number of recorded putts (putts only counted if on the green).

If scores are equal countback system applies:

GROSS - Countback gross the last 3 holes added and lowest wins, if they are equal go back the last 6, if they are equal go back hole by hole starting at the 9th then 8th etc.

NETT - Countback nett (work out handicap by dividing by 3) eg the Beginner Junior handicap is 30 it is now 10 then add the last 3 holes and minus the new handicap lowest wins.

MONTHLY MEDAL

On the first Saturday of every month MEMBERS ONLY QUALIFY to compete for the monthly medal. This competition the priority of prizes changes from 1st prize (score) Gross to 1st prize (score) NETT.



Beginner Junior Membership

Scoring Process and Officiating

- 1. Scoring Table: a dedicated scoring table in the Pacific Junior Room where players and markers, accompanied by their parents, officially submit their scorecards to the officials. This process will allow for the scores to be reviewed and marked on the spot, ensuring that all calculations are correct before leaving the competition. The cards with be swapped within the group so everyone agrees on all scores.
- 2. **Official Card Submission**: Players must hand over their scorecards to the officials at the scoring table immediately upon completion of their round. If they fail to do this, they will unfortunately be disqualified. This will prevent the possibility of players taking their scorecards away to adjust later.
- 3. Immediate Attention to Discrepancies: Having the players and their parents present during the card submission will allow any discrepancies or issues to be addressed and resolved promptly, avoiding delays or confusion afterward. The official on the day will have the final say if any discrepancies if the player is dissatisfied with the outcome, it should be addressed to the committee in writing contact information on the Pacific website.

Par 3 Local Rules

Junior Beginners – Par 3 Course

- Hole 1: Free relief from rocks, pebbles, bare patches, and along the mini golf fence.
- Holes 4, 5 & 6: If a ball is unplayable in trees/vegetation, drop at point of entry with a 1-stroke penalty.
- Out-of-Bounds: Fences around residential properties are OOB; re-hit with a 1-stroke penalty.
- Free Relief: Allowed from tree roots, course furniture, and protective fencing between holes 2 & 3.
- One Free Air Swing Per Hole.
- Maximum 10 Shots Per Hole: After 8 shots, players place the ball on the green's edge for putting.
- Monthly Medal & Seasonal Cups: Members only can win prizes.
- Club Championship Eligibility: Players must have competed in at least five rounds within three months before the event (special exemptions may apply).
- Intermediate & Full Junior Members: May play but cannot win prizes and are exempt from competition fees. Their participation is encouraged for social and mentorship purposes.



Competitions

9-Hole Main Course Competition

- When: Saturday at 3:00pm
- Who: Intermediate Junior Members
- Cost: \$5
- Meet: In front of Pro Shop / Junior Room
- Guests: You can invite a non-member (pricing is \$5)
- Note: If under 12 years of age, a parent/guardian needs to be present to supervise/caddy/help.
- Prizes:
 - Example: If 16 kids participate, that's \$80 total. Approximately 70-80% will be allocated to prize vouchers redeemable in the Pro Shop. The remainder will be recorded in the junior account for use in larger events such as championships and monthly medals.

Handicap

Hand in 1st card to get handicap eg. if shot 20 over par their handicap will be 20 the following week.

Any Intermediate that shoots under par with their handicap (36 nett) eg. if have 32 nett which is 4 under their handicap you ½ the under par nett score difference which is 2 new handicap for the next week is 2 less, if shoot a 33 nett that's 3 under par ½ that is 1.5 always round up next week handicap will be reduced by 2. If they get to 10 or less handicap off the yellow boys and girls move to red off new handicap of 2 more. E.g. If off 10 now off 12 the Girls will be inspired to go for an 18-hole handicap and Become a Junior Member. If then get to 10 or less handicap boys add to shots to your (new handicap) and will be playing off the white tees, then if the junior gets to 10 or less add another 2 shots to their handicap and they play off blue tees.

Then when they get to single figured off the white or blue tees, we suggest they go for their 18 Hole Handicap and become a Junior Member. If the Junior has a GA, they can play on a Saturday afternoon BUT if time permits. E.g. Winter will be Intermediate juniors only and they will play off their GA and can choose any colour tee off they like with their handicap adjusted accordingly.

This competition offers great exposure to our main course, with players teeing off from the front tees up to the back tees. Learn the etiquette and rules while you adapt to the course, all in the company of your peers.

A Junior can invite a friend only once to come and play but must have a TEE Mates Handicap to play but not on Monthly Medal or Championship Days.

Note: Any Junior Member can play in the Par 3 Competition on Saturday morning but will be in a different prize category.



Competitions

Junior Intermediate Competition

Intermediate Junior Members who have successfully progressed from Beginners Saturday Par 3 competition may play in Intermediate Junior competition on Saturday afternoons at 3pm, providing they have a financial Junior Intermediates Membership.

- Intermediate Junior Members may play in the 9-hole competition on the main course.
- Players tee off from the yellow tees
- Players progress to Red, White and Blue tees as they lower their handicap on each preceding tee.
- Play a monthly medal in alignment with the main Saturday field
- Players are encouraged to bring a parent or caddie to assist in speed of play

Intermediate to Junior Progression Requirements

Intermediate Juniors must meet these requirements over the 9-hole Intermediate competitions on a Saturday. An Intermediate Junior Member must:

- Demonstrate a basic knowledge of the rules which may be confirmed via a simple test
- Completed a minimum 25 rounds in the Intermediate competition or similar
- Can get around the main course unaided and push own buggy
- Demonstrate appropriate maturity/ behaviour
- Demonstrate understanding and application of correct golf etiquette
- Have a GA handicap of 27 or less for boys and 30 or less for girls
- Upgrade to Junior Full membership. Once the Junior Intermediate progresses into Junior Full
 membership they are no longer eligible to win any prizes in the Junior Intermediate
 Membership category they can continue to play and are not required to pay competition entry
 fee.
- Final decisions on progression are at the discretion of the Junior Golf Committee and Club Professionals.



Score Cards & Scoring System

- 1. Score cards must be legible
- 2. Name clear with surname
- 3. Gross score carried into top section
- 4. Nett score calculated (gross minus handicap)
- 5. Hand in card, card processor checks scores and nett are added up correctly
- GROSS SCORE Lowest Gross score winner (same prize as nett winner)
- NETT SCORE Lowest Nett score winner (cannot win Gross and Nett)
- NETT RUNNER UP 2nd lowest Nett score winner (cannot win Gross and Nett Runner up)
- LEAST PUTTS Player with least number of putts.
- NEAREST TO PIN (NTP) Player with recorded closest shot (either 1st or 2nd shot) to the hole. Choice of hole usually predetermined by pro shop but can be chosen on day by organiser/ consensus as can either 1st or 2nd shot.

NB. NO PLAYER SHOULD WIN 2 PRIZES FROM 1 - 4. The objective here is to provide as many opportunities as possible for players to have a chance to win a prize.

If scores are equal countback system applies:

GROSS - Countback gross the last 3 hole add and lowest wins, if they are equal go back the last 6, if they are equal go back hole by hole starting at the 9th then 8th etc.

NETT - Countback nett (work out handicap by dividing by 3) eg the Intermediate handicap is 18 it is now 6 then add the last 3 holes and minus the new handicap lowest wins

LEAST PUTTS – Countback as per Gross countback (if player already won prize exclude from countback however can note lost on countback)

MONTHLY MEDAL

On the first Saturday of every month MEMBERS ONLY compete for the monthly medal. This competition the priority of prizes changes from 1st prize (score) Gross to 1st prize (score) NETT. No Coaching on the course during a club championship event.



Scoring Process & Officiating

Implementation of a Scoring Table: Set up a dedicated scoring table in the Pacific Junior Room where players and markers, accompanied by their parents, officially submit their scorecards to the officials. This process will allow for the scores to be reviewed and marked on the spot, ensuring that all calculations are correct before leaving the competition. - 2. **Official Card Submission:** Players must hand over their scorecards to the officials at the scoring table immediately upon completion of their round. Immediate Attention to Discrepancies: Having the players and their parents present during the card submission will allow any discrepancies or issues to be addressed and resolved promptly, avoiding delays or confusion afterward. The official on the day will have the final say if any discrepancies if the player is dissatisfied with the outcome, it should be addressed to the committee in writing contact information on the Pacific website.

Intermediate Local Rules

Junior Intermediates - Main Course

- 1. Players begin from yellow tees
- 2. Players MAY progress to RED tees ONLY have a handicap of 10 or less from yellow tees (handicap adjustment applies 2 strokes to next tee)
- 3. Maximum of 10 shots per hole
- 4. No preferred lies unless course conditions apply.
- 5. Maximum of 2 attempts over the water. When the ball goes in a Red or Yellow Hazard area you can drop another ball as per normal golf rules but only get 2 attempts to get over the hazard. E.g. Creek on the 1st for 1 then drop one playing your 3rd then hit it in the water again, then drop another one playing your 5th then hit it in the water drop on the other side of the water playing your 7th shot.
- 6. Bunkers as per the rules of golf but if a junior hits into the bunker only 2 attempts are allowed to get out then with a 1 shot penalty drop at the side of the bunker no closer to the hole.
- 7. Maximum shots on a hole is 10.
- 8. Rules of Golf apply in all other instances and players to follow local course rules where applicable (E.g. Card length relief only if current local rule)
- 9. Coaching is allowed to help your junior player but not permitted on Monthly Medal or Club Championship events then normal golf rules apply.
- 10. As play can commence late and with reduced light available ready golf is recommended as per Pacific Golf Club rules.
- 11.CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP Intermediates must have played 5 rounds in 3 months prior to event.
- 12. Full Junior members are welcome to play, however they are ineligible to win and comp fees not required. (participation should be encouraged for social/mentor capacity).



Junior Membership

Competitions

9-Hole Main Course Competition

- When: Friday at 3:40pm
- Who: 18-hole juniors with a handicap
- Cost: \$5
- Meet: In front of the Pro Shop / Junior Room
- Guests: You can invite a non-member (pricing is \$5, limited to one invitation per non-member)
- Prizes:
 - Example: If 16 kids participate, that's \$80 collected, with 70-80% distributed as prize vouchers for the Pro Shop.
 - Records will be kept in the junior account to allow for larger prizes in major events (e.g., Championships, Monthly Medal).

Handicap

Handicap is rounded out on the players GA eg. 4.4 is 4 and 4.5 is 5So, example if the player is off 5 they may get 3 shots the front and 2 shots the back.

Note: You can invite a Junior Friend to play a Non-Member only once must have a GA Handicap.

18-Hole Main Course Competition

- When: Saturday
- Who: Junior members
- Cost: Members: \$10 / Monthly Medal: \$15
- Junior Spots: 16 allocated spots in the afternoon (preferred for juniors under 15 years).
 - o If a junior is 15 years or over, they can register in any available Saturday competition slot
 - If a junior is **under** 15 years and has a single-figure handicap, they can register in any available Saturday competition slot 72 hours in advance.
 - On Fridays at 6 AM, any unclaimed junior spots become available to members or single-figure handicap juniors.
- Guest Policy: Non-members may be invited but only with approval from the Director of Golf at Pacific Golf Club.
- Prizes:
 - Example: If 16 kids participate, that's \$160 collected, with 70-80% allocated as Pro Shop prize vouchers.
 - Remaining funds go into the junior account to support larger events (e.g., Championships, Monthly Medal).

Junior Member Competition

Junior Members who have successfully progressed from Intermediate competition may play on the main course in the main Saturday field providing they are full financial Junior Members of PGC.

- First 3 rounds are to gain an official GA handicap
- Juniors will play the same competition format as the main course and play off respective tees
- Medal rounds will be played in conjunction with the main field, as well as the Medal of Medals
- Juniors are not able to rent carts themselves



Junior Membership

Score Cards & Scoring System

9-Hole Competition

- 1. Score cards must be legible
- 2. Name clear with surname
- 3. Gross score carried into top section
- 4. Nett score calculated (gross minus handicap)
- 5. Hand in card, card processor checks scores and nett are added up correctly
- NETT SCORE Lowest Nett score winner (cannot win Gross and Nett)
- NETT RUNNER UP 2nd lowest Nett score winner (cannot win Gross and Nett Runner up)
- NEAREST TO PIN (NTP) Player with recorded closest shot to the hole. Choice of hole usually predetermined by organizer.

Note if have enough players a Gross prize can be added.

If scores are equal countback system applies:

For 9 Hole Competition

GROSS - Countback gross the last 3 hole add and lowest wins, if they are equal go back the last 6, if they are equal go back hole by hole starting at the 9th then 8th etc.

NETT - Countback nett work out their Stableford points on the last 3 holes if equal go back 6 holes if equal go back hole by hole starting at the 9th, then 8th etc.

Club Champions also need to be looked at for eligibility as they should be playing at least 5 rounds in the 3 months leading up to the tournament.
